 details (name, score, grade, opposition & date). Their name and score are added to the NWCC Bill

- Any player in competitive cricket who achieves a hat-trick during the season is presented with a
 trophy containing the match ball, and for those achieved in competitive cricket their name and
 figures are added to the NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 5 or more wickets in an innings is presented with a
 trophy containing the match ball, and for those performances achieved in competitive cricket, their
 name and figures are added to the Somaiya Acheson NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 7 or more wickets in an innings or 10 or more wickets in a match, is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those performances achieved in competitive cricket, their name and figures are added to the NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any player who has played for NWCC in 100 competitive games (excluding Kimbo Cup and John Hayne Cup) is presented with a NWCC red & black baggy cap embroidered with "100" and their initials.
- Players, coaches and managers in teams that win their competition are presented with a NWCC Premiership plaque. HK&HDCA presents the players with a NWCC embroidered red & black baggy cap.
- Each team Coach and Manager is recognised for their efforts throughout the season.

SENIOR CRICKET CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

The 2023-2024 season started in a winning way with the Preseason T20 comp, we nominated teams in the 2nd and 4th Divisions. The 2nd Division made it through the final and won easily over Kissing Point at Auluba Oval in front of a healthy crowd. Craig Woods was awarded the T20 player of the season.

The 2023-2024 season saw the return to NWCC nominating 4 teams to the senior competition, A Reserve, B Reserve, C Reserve and a C3 father and son team.

The club had a very successful season that saw the A2 and C3 teams crowned Premiers, the B2 team lost a tight one in the semifinal to eventual premiers WPHC.

Our C2 team courageously lead by Andrew WATTO Watson had a tough season due to losing a lot of valuable players throughout the season topping up the other teams which saw the team struggle for a consistent playing lineup.

The club spirit during the season was at a level not seen for years with the younger players from the C3 team turning up to training and keeping the older players on their toes. It was great to see plenty of players and family from all teams turn up to the balcony at Normo at end of their matches to cheer on those playing at Normo and dissect the action across all four matches from the weekend.

A Reserve

A Reserve Grade came into this season looking to avenge last season's B Grade Grand Final. The team set the tone early in the season going through to the Christmas break undefeated, also having claimed the 2nd Grade T20 competition and making a trip to Wilberforce to participate in the NSW Community Cup.

After the break, the team continued to generate momentum heading towards the finals, finishing the regular season with 7 wins, 2 draws and 2 narrow losses resulting in Normo claiming the minor premiership.

The team went into the finals campaign wanting to add more silverware to the cabinet and got the first job done against Castle Hill which meant it was another showdown with Hornsby, last year's B Grade Premiers, for the A2s shield.

It was not the ideal start for the team, finding themselves 2/9, before some solid batting from Will and Luke got the team back on the front foot. Unfortunately, Normo was bundled out for 85 thanks to a tight bowling effort from Hornsby. The boys however were confident that this would be their year, and Captain Jordy Hayes had a plan up his sleeve, which was in the works for weeks. The three-man bowling rotation of Aaron Kerr (4/31), Elliot Kerr (4/25) and Luke Sylvester (1/16) hit their areas and along with the field placements from Jordy, the boys bowled Hornsby out for 74, with Aaron Kerr and Rob Jones combining for the match winning run out. In the second innings, it seemed like it was going to be a case of déjà vu with Normo 7/94, before Aaron Kerr and Josh Hegarty showed maturity beyond their years to see the team home and finish as A2 Premiers.

There were many highlights this season, including Cam Griffin scoring 143 against Sydney Lions on a tough Glade wicket. Jordy Hayes made a very important 99, Luke

Sylvester also made some half centuries rescuing the team from difficult situations.

With the ball the team had Elliot Kerr, Sam Hogan, Josh Hegarty and Aaron Kerr each collect a 5-wicket haul. Aaron also collected 11 wickets in a match against Hornsby, which included figures of 7/33. Rob with the gloves was reliable as always, finishing with 26 dismissals for the season across all matches.

Thanks to Jordy for captaining the team this season and thanks to all of the players involved, whether they played every game or just one game in the team, as they all were an important part of the team's success this season.

B Reserve

As Normo needed to win match to progress to the final we declared at the start of day 2 and quickly had WPHC in trouble at 5-35 thanks to Charles Liney taking 4 quick wickets. Unfortunately, Charles suffered an equipment failure (shoe blowout) which restricted his bowling and we were unable to make any further break throughs losing late in the day.

Charles Liney was leading bowler with 22 wickets at 14.73. Charles and Sahil Kumar both took 5 wicket hauls during season. Craig Woods was the leading run scorer with 225 runs with average of 25.

C Reserve

Normo C2 was made up of players of last year's D grade and some new and returning Normo players. The team did not win as many games as they wanted to this year, lack of runs hurt as in most games. We were in a number of the games, but things did not go our way. All games were played in the right spirit and all players

enjoyed themselves. The team improved throughout the whole season.

Some of highlights of the season were Luke Ahern 102 and 64 in consecutive innings, Max McKern and Luke Ahern putting on 100 runs for the 4th wicket in the second last game. Charles Liney and Aditya Sheorayan taking 4thers. Max McKern taking 6 catches in single match. Reon Rebello taking an incredible hattrick that he was very happy to share with everyone.

We were happy with the total, but knew we would have to bowl well. The required run rate was less than 3 on a good Normo Oval. However, we had nothing to be concerned with. T20

This season, Normo put out two T20 teams onto the field. The 4th Division team won one game and lost one game, using it as an opportunity to dust off the cobwebs heading into their regular season. The 2nd Division T20 side also won one game and lost another. However, as fate would have it, the 2nd division team would qualify for the finals thanks to quotient.

Normo came up against Sydney Lions in the semi-final, the team which defeated Normo in the prior match. However, the boys went out there and put in an outstanding performance, with Jordy and Woodsy putting together a match winning partnership. This meant Normo qualified for the final against Kissing Point. Once again, the end of season Presentation Day was held at Pennant Hills Bowling Club with a game of lawn bowls followed by the presentations.
