- Each new junior player starting his or her junior cricket with NWCC is presented with a personalised plaque. Each season after that, a new team plate is presented to be added to their plaque (there's room for 10 plates).
- Each junior team Coach / Manager or senior team Captain awards 3 individual trophies to recognise special achievements (2 individual trophies are awarded for the Under 9, Under 10 and Under 11 teams due to the reduced number of players in these sides).
- Each team Coach / Manager also nominate players for the club's perpetual trophies, from which the winners are selected by the NWCC Committee.
- Any player in competitive cricket who scores a century is presented with a minibat outlining the details (name, score, grade, opposition & date). Their name and score are added to the NWCC Bill Kemsley Batsmens' Honour Board.
- Any player in competitive cricket who achieves a hat-trick during the season is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those achieved in competitive cricket their name and figures are added to the NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 5 or more wickets in an innings is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those performances achieved in competitive cricket, their name and figures are added to the Somaiya Acheson NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 7 or more wickets in an innings or 10 or more wickets in a match, is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those performances achieved in competitive cricket, their name and figures are added to the NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any player who has played for NWCC in 100 competitive games (excluding Kimbo Cup and John Hayne Cup) is presented with a NWCC red & black baggy cap embroidered with "100" and their initials.
- Players, coaches and managers in teams that win their competition are presented with a NWCC Premiership plaque. HK&HDCA presents the players with a NWCC embroidered red & black baggy cap.
- Each team Coach and Manager is recognised for their efforts throughout the season.

SENIOR CRICKET CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

The 2022-2023 season saw the return of the Preseason T20 comp, we had teams in the 2nd and 4th Division. Both Teams failed to make the Final but enjoyed some close games and competition. Hugo Di Veroli was awarded the T20 player of the season.

NWCC entered 3 teams to the senior competition, B1, C1 and D1 competitions. We once again saw the transition of our U15 team to the Senior level with our D grade side having a good combination of a few seasoned players, Juniors playing first full Senior Year and a couple of Dads joining their sons on the Cricket field together for the first time.

The club had a mixture of success during the season with C and D grade both having their share of winning and losing matches. B Grade had a very successful year finishing Minor Premiers but unfortunately losing the Grand Final in a battle with Hornsby.

The club had the youngest average age amongst the teams the club has seen in years, only the work horses Naish Somaiya, Craig Woods, Peter Shannon and Woodsy's Duncan Fearnley bat bringing the average age up. With the Youth and those soon to enter their 20's the club is a very strong position going forward and will keep climbing the grades.

B Grade

B Grade ended the regular season with a dominant performance against West Pennant Hills Red. Needing only a draw to secure the minor premiership, the team batted 100 overs before shaking hands mid-way through day two. This included an impressively patient 60 not out by Harry, who carried his bat, combining nicely with Jordy who top scored with 71.

Carrying this momentum into the semi-final against the same opponents, the team was able to pile on 266, with Luke Colquhoun scoring the club's solitary century for the season of 105 not out. The team defended the total, restricting West Penno to 104 and were off to the final.

In the final we came up against Hornsby, the only team to beat Normo in the regular season – twice. Batting first, Normo only managed 96 in the first innings on a lively Storey Park wicket. An inspired 4/16 from Luke Sylvester at the start of day two restricted Hornsby's lead to just 64. Jordy (50 from 50 balls) and Luke Colquhoun (80 not out off 89 balls) proved pivotal in Normo setting Hornsby a tempting 125 to chase. Luke was set for his second century before a shoulder injury sustained while hitting a six ended his innings prematurely.

Unfortunately, Hornsby ended the day on 5/99, winning first innings and proving to be the team Normo just couldn't beat.

Other season highlights included Aaron's 5/39, Scott's 5/48, and Elliot's 4/31 against Sydney Lions to win outright. Will's mature 75 not out, defending against an outright loss to Hornsby. Tim's 5/23 and Ian's counter attacking innings at the top of the order against Berowra. Rob was ever consistent behind the stumps, taking 19 dismissals across the season. Notably, Luke Colquhoun and Jordy were the top two run scorers in the competition. Aaron was the second top wicket taker, just one off the leader.

Thanks to everyone for an enjoyable season and thanks to Jordy for taking over the captaincy this with great success.
